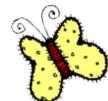

4. Seek medical attention early if your child has flu like symptoms.

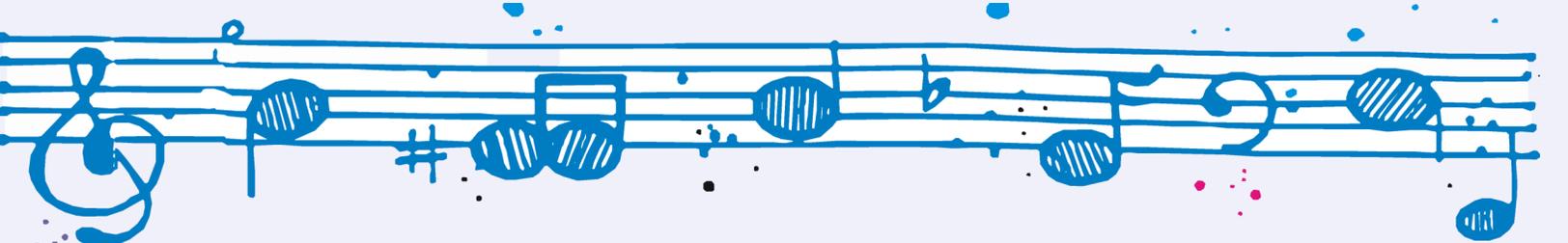


# Please ...
