We will be celebrating grandparents during our **30th Annual Grandparents' Week** to be held February 9th—13th. During the 2026—27 school year, morning tuition will be increased for Preschool and Kindergarten. Preschool monthly morning tuition cost will now be \$400 and Kindergarten tuition will be \$450. 


A Message From the School Board

Grandparent's Chapel: Wednesday, February 11th, 9:00 am in the Church. Grandparents please join us!



Health and Safety At School

Help Us Control The Spread Of Germs At School . . .

Please do not send the following items to school

- **Water Bottles:** All of our students drink from disposable cups and we serve water all day long. These bottles could be accidentally used by other students.
- **Pacifiers:** These end up on the floor; could be accidentally used by other students.
- **Large Pillows and Bed Rolls:** All bedding is required to be wrapped separately to prevent the spread of germs and head lice. Larger bedding is difficult to seal and store.
- **Toys:** Please do not bring toys from home to school. Some are choking hazards, are easily broken and not sanitized. Please check backpacks and remove small items (ex: coins, miniature toys).
- **Hand Sanitizer and Chapstick:** These items are shared and sometimes ingested by our young students.
- Please keep your child's **fingernails** clipped short and clean.

Note: If lip balm is needed, a Medication Form must be filled out in the Office.

Blocks: In the Block Center I'm developing math concepts and motor skills. I'm also learning how to share and work with my friends. I may use these skills as an architect or builder when I grow up.
