

The Holy Eucharist: Rite Two

May 22, 2022 11:15 AM

The Sixth Sunday of Easter

Welcome to St. Peter's Episcopal Church The liturgy today continues to be concerned with exploring the consequences of Christ's resurrection and our new life in him through baptism and Eucharist.

Today's gospel reading is a portion of the discourses between Jesus and the disciples on the evening before his crucifixion. Here Jesus talks about the union between himself and the Father. This union is shared with us so that we can say with St. Paul, "not I, but Christ in me." The source of that union is the Holy Spirit given us in Baptism. The ultimate result of this union is peace; in Hebrew, *Shalom*. Shalom is the restored unity of the creation with God, and the resultant reconciliation between all peoples.

In the first reading, Paul, Silas, Timothy, and Luke come to Philippi, the first time the gospel moves from Asia Minor to Europe. There Paul encounters a woman who worshipped God although she was a Gentile. After hearing Paul proclaim the resurrection of Jesus, she and her household were baptized and her house became Paul's center of ministry there and quite likely the home of the church in that city.

It is not the created universe that is the ultimate destiny of the human race but the new, perfect city of God's Kingdom. John, in today's reading from the Revelation, envisions the perfection and peace of that Kingdom.

Shalom—the peace and wholeness of God's Spirit—is our destiny and our present reality. The peace and unity of God's reign is revealed in the inclusiveness of the church as people of every race and nation are called by God. In the Eucharist, we have the foretaste of the new life in the holy city prepared for us by God.






immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them.

We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us.

And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day—and there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. All those who choose not to receive the Sacrament or are unable to receive are able to make a Spiritual Communion, as the Prayer Book directs on page 457: "If a person desires to receive the Sacrament, but, by reason of extreme sickness or physical disability, is unable to eat and drink the Bread and Wine, the Celebrant is to assure that person that all the benefits of Communion are received, even though the Sacrament is not received with the mouth."





Other coordinators of the Summits are Monsignor Robert Vitillo, representing Cardinal Jean-Louis Tauran, President of the Pontifical Council of Interreligious Dialogue in the Roman Curia, the Vatican, and Dr. Rasoul Rasoulipour, representing Ayatollah Mostafa Mohaghegh Domad and the International Center for Interfaith Dialogue which belongs to the Organization for Islamic Cultures and Religions, Tehran. The Summits have met in Washington, DC in 2010, in Beirut in 2012, in Rome in 2014 and in Tehran in 2016.

Along with Archbishop of Canterbury, the Honourable George Leonard Carey, Canon Peterson founded the Compass Rose Society, a Society that today supports the ministry of the Anglican Communion. Canon Peterson was elected President of the Anglican Communion's Compass Rose Society in 2013 and now serves the Society as a former President.

Canon Peterson is a Board Member of the Diocese of Jerusalem's Princess Basma Centre for Children with Disabilities and a Member of the Board of the Spafford Children's Center, Old City Jerusalem. He has been on the Advisory Circle of the American Friends of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem. As Secretary General of the Anglican Communion, he served as a Governor of the Anglican Centre in Rome and as a member of the Advisory Council of the Anglican Observer at the United Nations.
