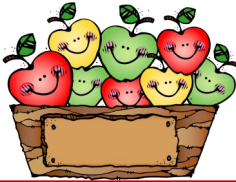

Consumer Product Safety Commission**

Children's Toys:

Did you know? CPSC, in collaboration with U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP), seized more than 1.1 million dangerous or illegal toys in fiscal year 2023. Of those, nearly 101,000 toy seizures were lead related.

- Follow age guidance and other safety information on toy packaging and choose toys that match each child's interests and abilities.
- Get safety gear, including helmets, for scooters and other riding toys—and make sure that children use them every time.
- Keep small balls and toys with small parts away from children younger than age 3 and keep deflated balloons away from children younger than age 8.
- Once the gifts are open, immediately discard plastic wrappings or other packaging on toys before they become dangerous playthings.

Important Information regarding Medications

By law, if your child needs to take any medication, St. Peter's Episcopal School must abide by the following:

Medications must:

1. Be in the original container;
2. Be labeled with the child's name;
3. Be labeled with the date;
4. Include directions to administer the medication, complete and sign the School's Medication Form;
5. If prescribed, include the name of the physician prescribing the medication;



PLEASE DO NOT put medicine in backpacks or lunch boxes. Hand the medicine to the Early Bird or carpool teacher and **SIGN** the school medication form. At the end of the day, let us know if you need it sent home. One of our teachers will personally give it to you at pick up time.
