
My Bug Collection

KEEPING KIDS HEALTHY

- 1. Keep students home if they are sick, help us prevent illness from spreading.
- Have children wash hands frequently with soap and water.
 Wash for <u>20</u> seconds.
 - 3. Cover your mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing. We teach them to cough into their elbow (not their hands).
 - 4. Seek medical attention early if your child has flu like symptoms.

Episcopal School Sunday


Sunday, October 5th St. Peter's Church 10:00am Service


